The funding will go towards the creation of a brand new Centre that will offer comprehensive services and programming to 16 to 35-year-olds, in an inclusive and community-based environment. Opening in fall 2019, the new Centre (name TBD) will provide an inclusive environment for individuals to connect and form supportive relationships as well as advocacy, training, education, employment and empowerment opportunities.

JFCS Northern NJ Joins Forces with Catholic Charities to Feed the Hungry



Jewish Family & Children's Services of Northern New Jersey and Catholic Charities have joined forces to feed the hungry. Both organizations shared a common goal: to serve the vulnerable of Northern NJ by feeding families facing food insecurity, through our food pantries. Having identified this common objective, CCAN chose to share resources with JFCS for more effective distribution to the community. This initiative involves a monthly donation of approximately 500 pounds of fresh produce from Trader Joe's, and a frequent donation from Gova Foods to our two food pantries in Teaneck and Fair Lawn. And JFCS is sharing recent food donations from Osem (owned by Nestle) with the CCAN food pantry too.

This event, founded by the Essl Foundation, brings together over 700 experts from more than 70 countries to focus on best practices in inclusive projects and strategies to advance access in all arenas for individuals with disabilities. In her co-keynote, Jennifer spoke on work that fights implicit bias which limits jobs and other opportunities for people with disabilities.
